EASEMENT ISSUES FROM A LAW AND POLICY PERSPECTIVE

EASEMENTS ARE AN EFFECTIVE TOOL FOR PROTECTING HISTORIC RESOURCES WHEN USED APPROPRIATELY. A FOCUS ON COASTAL AND MARINE MANAGED AREAS IN HISTORIC PRESERVATION

THE RECENT REPORT OF THE *US COMMISSION ON OCEAN POLICY* RECOGNIZED THE IMPORTANCE OF OUR COASTAL AND MARINE NATURAL, CULTURAL AND HISTORIC RESOURCES TO OUR NATION'S IDENTITY AND PROSPERITY. MORE THAN 50 PERCENT OF THE NATION'S POPULATION RESIDES IN COASTAL COUNTIES AND COASTAL TOURISM IS ONE OF THE FASTEST GROWING SECTORS OF THE US ECONOMY MAKING IT MORE IMPORTANT THAN EVER THAT WE ACT AS GOOD STEWARDS OF THESE IRREPLACEABLE RESOURCES. THIS SESSION WILL PROVIDES EXAMPLES OF STATE AND FEDERAL INITIATIVES TO IDENTIFY AND INVENTORY COASTAL HERITAGE RESOURCES; DEVELOP AREA-BASED HERITAGE RESOURCE CONSERVATION AND PRESERVATION PLANS; AND DEVELOPING COASTAL HERITAGE RESOURCE OUTREACH AND ECOTOURISM STRATEGIES. THE SESSION WILL ALSO HIGHLIGHT NOW NOAA'S NATIONAL MPA CENTER AND PRESERVE AMERICA INITIATIVES CAN FOSTER STEWARDSHIP OF OUR CULTURAL AND HISTORIC RESOURCES.
